lt's a scam

It is easy to get caught out by a fraudster, even in the comfort of your own home.

A fraudster may phone you claiming to be a police officer or an official from your bank. The caller may sound very genuine. The police or your bank will **never** ask for your PIN or password details to transfer funds or withdraw cash/valuables for someone to collect.

Be aware that fraudsters might target you in one of the following ways:



Phone calls out of the blue




Claims to be your bank or police



Advise you of an issue with your banking



Sends courier to collect cash/valuables

If a crime is in progress or life is in danger, **always dial 999**



Note down anything that hasn't felt right. Include dates and times. It will be useful if you need to report this information at a later date.
